



GUIDELINES FOR POSTER PRESENTERS

1. Format & Size

- **Orientation:** Portrait
- **Size:** Standard A0 841 mm wide × 1189 mm high (~84.1 cm × 118.9 cm)

2. Visual Design & Legibility

- Make the display as self-explanatory as possible.
- The poster may include tables, graphs, photographs or illustrations. All of the materials should be of sufficient size so they can be easily read at a reasonable distance of 1 to 1.5 meters by the readers.
- **Font choices:** Clean, sans-serif (Arial, Helvetica, Calibri)
 - **Title:** Minimum 72 pt
 - **Section headings:** 48 - 60 pt
 - **Body text:** 24 - 36 pt
- **Visuals:** High-resolution figures/graphs (≥ 300 dpi); use colour contrast (dark text on light background)
- **White space:** Keep margins and spacing to avoid clutter

3. Content Structure

Include the following logical flow:

1. Title & Authors/Affiliations: Top of the poster
2. Abstract (as submitted, with minimal clarifications if required)
3. Introduction / Objectives
4. Methods
5. Results: Main focus (use graphs, tables, charts)
6. Discussion / Conclusions

6. References / Acknowledgments / Conflict of Interest (usually small at bottom)

4. On-Site Poster Handling

- Attach using provided materials (Velcro, tape); avoid nails or adhesives

5. Presenter Engagement

- Prepare a 2-to-3-minute summary to explain your research while standing next to your poster during session breaks, be ready for questions and networking

6. Submission & Registration

- **Registration is free** but required, please register [here](#). **(Closes on 7 April)**
- Abstract **submission deadline: 11 March 2026**
- Confirm registration and participation by **25 March 2026** for poster inclusion
- Authors are responsible for printing and bringing the poster to de Congress venue (on-site printing not available)
